5.1 BALLAJURA INTERGENERATIONAL PLAYSPACE

KEY ISSUES

• One of the City's advocacy priority items is the construction of an all-abilities playground in Ballajura.

- City staff have worked with Ward Councillors to complete a conceptual design of the playground at a location on Oxleigh Drive in Ballajura.
- The local community was consulted on the concept design in November 2021.
- The City received 250 responses, with 240 of respondents supportive of the intergenerational playspace.
- City staff have reviewed the feedback, with concerns mainly in relation to the selected location.
- Requests for additional embellishments have been assessed, with recommendations made within the report.

It is recommended that the Council proceed with the detailed design of the Ballajura Intergeneration Playspace, including some of the embellishments identified during community consultation, and to advise submitters of the resolution.

BACKGROUND

At the 12 February 2020 Ordinary Meeting of Council, it was resolved to form the City's Advocacy Priorities 2020-21 Program. One of the priorities was; "the construction of an all-abilities playground in Ballajura". Further support was given at the 8 April 2020 Ordinary Council Meeting, where Council adopted the draft Ballajura Local Area Plan 2020, which had the action to "Advocate for the construction of an all-abilities playground in Ballajura".

To assist with advocacy, City staff undertook a desktop analysis to identify potential locations for the all-abilities playground within Ballajura. Locations were presented to Councillors, with a consensus to proceed with concept designs at the Public Open Space located at Oxleigh Drive, on the corner of Cassowary Drive and Illawarra Crescent South.

In November 2021, City staff conducted community consultation with the Ballajura Community. This included a letter drop to all residences and businesses within a 550m radius of the proposed location, a "Have Your Say" webpage and four community drop-in consultation sessions, with one specifically targeting feedback from the students at the Ballajura Community College. The City received a total of 250 responses, with 240 respondents supportive of having an all-abilities playground.

As the project has progressed, the term used to name the project has changed. Due to its functionality the 'All-Abilities Playground' was changed to the 'Ballajura Intergenerational Playspace'.

DETAILS

The main concern raised by the community in relation to the Ballajura Intergenerational Playspace was the proposed location at Oxleigh Drive Ballajura, on the corner of Cassowary Drive and Illawarra Crescent South. Community members also had concerns with the traffic volumes on the adjacent roads, the drainage ability of the site, being situated too close to businesses and the high school and being situated away from the majority of residential houses within Ballajura.

Traffic volumes

Recent traffic counts indicate that Illawarra Crescent South (east of Oxleigh Drive) carries 7,413 vehicles per day. The majority of this traffic occurs during the AM Peak on weekdays between the hours of 8:00-9:00am. During these times, the activity at the playspace is expected to be low, with the main usage anticipated to occur on weekends and after school. The traffic volumes on Cassowary Drive and Townsend Street are of less volumes (3201 and 2938 vehicles per day respectively). As a result, traffic volumes are not anticipated to be significant concern for a playspace at this location.

Drainage ability of site

The proposed site will be raised and drainage cells will be utilised to mitigate drainage concerns. This will allow the site to serve its drainage purpose, whilst providing a safe and functional site for the community.

Proximity of playspace

During the consultation, no local businesses raised concerns about the location of the playspace. Townsend Street will act as a separation between the playspace and business activity. In addition the business activity is anticipated to be at a reduced level during the peak periods of the playspace on weekends.

City staff view the close proximity to the schools, including Ballajura Community College, as a positive outcome from the local community. This location provides students a close and safe recreation opportunity to attend outside of school hours. Whilst City staff agree that the playspace is not located in the centre of residential houses, there are still good access opportunities to the site. This includes access roads, footpaths and public transportation.

Some respondents recommended that Kingfisher Oval be considered as an alternative location. Kingfisher Oval was considered as a potential location as part of the feasibility investigation. However, as Kingfisher Oval currently serves a number of competing purposes, it is already limited by available space. A number of sporting clubs utilise the oval, and the site provides a playspace, skatepark and BMX pump track. Without removing a portion of established trees and bushland, available space at Kingfisher Oval is limited and unable to support this proposed playspace.

In addition, suggestions and requests were made for; sufficient parking, shade, barbeques, fencing, sporting elements, water play items, safe access, crossing areas, flying foxes, exercise equipment, rock climbing walls, a dog area and wifi/charging areas.

- The current design intends to provide 48 parking bays which includes 22 in the formalised carpark and 26 on street bays. This is determined to be sufficient parking in order to cater for the anticipated use.
- A total of five shelters are proposed, one of which is a large shelter capable of supporting three picnic tables. The shelters are supported by a number of established and proposed trees, as well as shade sails above play equipment in sun exposed locations. Two double burner barbeques have also been proposed within the site.
- The proposed playspace is intended to be fenced, which will assist in providing a safe environment for users. As part of further design, alternative locations for the northern entry point will be considered. This will include discussions with the other government departments for the potential need for pedestrian crosswalks.
- Park lighting is included in the proposal, however CCTV is currently not included.
 City officers can include the provision of CCTV which is anticipated to cost around \$200,000 to install.
- Sporting elements such as basketball courts, soccer goals and skate parks are already provided in other public locations within 400m of the proposed location. Due to the limited available space and costing, it is not recommended to duplicate these embellishments at this proposed site.
- City staff will include minor water play items into the design. This will be in the form of water pumps and some carrying/moving equipment, estimated to cost around \$25,000. Larger water play is not recommended at this site due to the ongoing testing and maintenance requirements. The City's Aquatic Strategy suggests additional water playspaces (similar to Rainbow Waters) would be surplus to City requirements.
- Requests for a larger flying fox were received. The current design includes a flying fox at a length of 27.8m. As part of detail design the designers will consider whether a larger flying fox is possible.
- Exercise equipment was requested, and is already included within the current design. Unfortunately, it was not displayed via images to the community, but will be shown more clearly in future designs.
- A rock climbing wall has been requested. This is currently not included, however can be included, with a construction cost estimated at \$20,000.

- City staff have investigated the need for a dog activity area, however due to the
 intended nature of the play space being for families to play and recreate together,
 a dog park was not viewed as suitable at this location. The City is currently
 undertaking community consultation on dog access areas across the City, which
 may indicate better alternative sites.
- Community Wi-Fi and charging stations are not recommended at this site, as the intent of the playspace is to bring people together and promote the outdoors. As a result these embellishments are deemed not essential for this requirement.

CONSULTATION

City staff held four consultation sessions in November 2021. All residences and businesses within a 550m radius of the proposed intergenerational playspace location received a letter advising them of the project and opportunity to engage. The consultation drop-in sessions were held at the Kingfisher South Pavilion (2x) and the Ballajura Library. The fourth session was held with students at Ballajura Community College. Attendees had the opportunity to ask questions and learn more regarding the project proposal. A number of visual concepts were displayed to help create understanding.

Supplementary to the drop-in sessions, a webpage was set up on the City's 'Have Your Say' section, allowing all community members the opportunity to learn more and provide valued feedback. Social media campaigns were run to target Ballajura residents on Facebook and Instagram channels. The webpage was open for comments from 4 November, through until 24 November. Overall, the City received 245 responses on the 'Have Your Say' webpage.

The City also conducted three drop-in sessions at Kingfisher South Pavilion and Ballajura Library which were attended by 30 people, with the Ballajura Community College session attended by over 100. Five hand written submissions were received in person, with the vast majority of people preferring to submit their comments online.

In total the City received 250 responses; 240 in support and 10 in objection.

In January 2022, City staff briefed Ward Councillors on the community feedback.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

For the 2021/22 financial year, the City included \$20,000 on budget for the design of the proposed playspace.

The City currently does not have a confirmed budget for the construction and the project is listed as an advocacy item.

The proposed changes to the concept plan, along with landscaping adjustments to the design and adjustments to contingency percentages has increased the cost estimate to \$4,656,355. The additional elements which are recommended to be included are;

- 1. Change in northern entrance location (no cost)
- 2. CCTV (\$200k)
- 3. Minor water play elements (\$25k)
- 4. Rock climbing wall (\$20k)



1	Resident	Support	I am honestly so excited for this play space, the design looks amazing. Just noting two things I have seen that I feel are a waste of money but seem to be added to so many playgrounds. Firstly the wooden teepees, I have 3 children of my own and I'm yet to see any children at any playground use them for play, and secondly those colourful round balls that stick out the ground on a concrete pole. Kids climb on them and quickly lose interest. I love that some musical instruments have been included which are great for all abilities, and trampolines are always so popular and usually have a queue to get on.
			Could a water pump be included in the nature play area with some form of chute to race leaves and to build dams across? It's great for children to build muscle strength and kids love water play. They can experiment how they can create a dam with rocks and sand, change the direction of the water, and see that things float and sink, choose different items to race, see what flows fast and what moves slow. Some form of water play is the only thing missing in this playground. Think of playgrounds that people will travel to, Kingsley Dinosaur Park, Rio Tinto Naturescape, and the Jungle Park at Whiteman Edge. These parks keep children entertained for hours because there is a good variety and water is always included. Well done! I'm so excited to see this come to fruition.
2	Resident	Support	A playground like this is something Ballajura desperately needs, but I worry about the location. The roads are busy, the area always gets flooded when it rains and it's close to the high school and businesses. Really hope this is something that can go ahead but hopeful a new location is found.
3	Resident	Support	Great idea. Locating a park in this section of Ballajura would be great. Easy access from Alexander Drive and Cassowary Drive means it can be found easier from both local residents of Ballajura and those who live elsewhere.
4	Resident	Support	Water play at parks is a much loved activity by my autistic son. Please incorporate a spot for this within. Fencing and shade is must. We are walking distance. Looking forward to this for sure. What will be the go for toilets and BBQ's being kept clean and useable? Hand dryers are a big sensory issue for a lot of kids on spectrum so best not to position them next to entry/exit doors. I suggest age limits perhaps on some play equipment to prevent high school students making it an unpleasant experience for little ones.
5	Resident	Support	Very excited to see a playspace that is accessible to our area via footpath. It is difficult for my kids to ride and walk to others playgrounds in the area due to lack of footpaths and distance. We are pleased that shade and greenery is a key feature of the playspace. Given that it is a busy road I would like road safety to be considered when accessing the playground.

6	Resident	Support	This is a great idea We back it up 100%
7	Resident	Support	I like the concept but not the location. As it is detached from the suburb it will become a haven for drug taking and other anti-social behaviour. At night there is no residences located close to the location, anything could happen. Because of its location it will be occupied by teens after and before school so I doubt families with small kids will use it. I think money would be better spent redeveloping the park in the Lakes Estate on the corner of Paradise Quays & Summerlakes Parade. This is one of the nicest spots in Ballajura and near the lake is not used to its full potential. With the retirement village coming one day, it would be a good spot for the Grandads/Nannas to meet with family and let the grandkids play.
8	Resident	Support	Ballajura is well overdue for a destination playground with full amenities. No other playgrounds in the suburb have a public toilet block. While across from the high school isn't ideal, as the youth in the area are known for trashing public spaces, I understand the need for a large playground to not be surrounded by residential streets. Therefore this probably is the only suitable location which includes ample parking. I 100% support the proposal. As the former admin of a large Ballajura community Facebook page, I can advise the desire for a destination playground was a regular topic with local residents.
9	Resident	Support	Ballajura desperately needs a huge play space - enclosed and fenced off. A lot of families in this area.
10	Resident	Support	Yes we need a better park for our kids BUT this location is horrible. It's an over flow for the storm water, and is surrounded by two main roads, one of which the high school is across from. Also the road which backs onto Malaga is used as a truck stop all week. This park seems to me like a huge financial burden with all the work that will need to be done to make it a safe environment for our kids. We have so many run down parks as it is, why can't you upgrade Kingfisher or the Lions Oval, or even some of the smaller parks instead? The work alone to move the water pipes is going to cost more than a total upgrade to one of our existing parks. The councillors also say this park will be local to everyone in Ballajura? How is that even true? It is local to Malaga/Ballajura Community College and a few houses on Illawarra Crescent. So again, yes we need a new park, but this choice of land is a horrible one. Unless of course you are going to pay for fencing all the way around, even then who wants a park so close to the main road. Go have a look at Coventry Markets new play space which sits right on Walter Roadsmells so delicious all those car and bus fumeswhy is this location even being considered when there are other Playspaces which have the room for improvement, let alone enough parking. The parking you guys are offering will be just enough for the overflow of cars from inflatable world on the weekend.
11	Resident	Support	I would like to see BBQ's/ picnic areas and possibly a nature play area for the kids.
12	Resident	Support	Also multiple bins with dog poo bags. I live in the city of Bayswater, and my children attend school at Mary MacKillop. We also are registered parishioners and attend church at Mary MacKillop on a weekly basis. A Playspace like the ones in the designs would be a great place to meet after school, during the weekend and on holidays, to continue to build positive community relationships, especially so close to school.
13	Resident	Support	About time City of Swan put in a proper Playspace in Ballajura. It's a shame they don't upgrade the playground at the end of Luton and

			Fordham Court. The play equipment and climbing structure is not aesthetically pleasing.
14	Resident	Support	I would like to see the toddler play area fenced. Also the playground itself to have no fireman's poles or rope climbers, they are dangerous. The only openings to it should be where you can enter it. Also no teepees, but a water play area for summer instead.
15	Resident	Support	This is a fantastic proposal and I commend the City for approaching this community infrastructure task. I love the idea of the different "play" zones within the space and trying to utilise the different equipment for different age groups. My first concern is the proximity to the High School and how this could cause possible issues with older youth making the space less inviting for families who might be worried about that. I didn't see any plans for lighting, and this is a major concern. The space needs to have sufficient lighting during the night for events, as well as keeping it safe from antisocial behaviour and misuse of the facilities. I think the space needs to be more oriented towards events, to allow for more food trucks and other stall-types. The toilet block is essential and must accommodate people with a disability, and have sufficient measures to prevent damages after hours. On that note, it is of upmost importance that this Playspace has options, not just one swing, for people with disabilities. So that anyone with limited ability or capacity may enjoy themselves in this public space. Also, what are the plans for fencing and access 24/7? I also hope that there is sufficient road traffic safety around this facility considering the increased foot traffic and younger children running around. Will there be a slower speed limit or perhaps speed bumps/speed measurement signs with smiley faces? I think this would be a great use of resources to ensure the safety of the community. I also think there needs to be an additional crosswalk from the High School to the Playspace to facilitate classroom activities and integration within the space, as the College is so oriented to our local Community. I also believe that this space needs to have adequate hydration facilities for both people and pets to ensure that all amenities are covered. Finally, due to the location, there will be businesses operating and industrial work being undertaken right next to the park. I believe it is important for the City to have consi
