The City of Swan are committed to improving your environment and minimising waste charges. People who live in the City of Swan make a difference by avoiding unnecessary waste, by reusing items and recycling responsibly. Following this commitment, the City will not be producing guides every year, so save the environment by keeping this one.

Be a GREAT sort. Make landfill the last resort.



Place bins out by 6am on collection day

At least 1m from cars, street signs or power poles.

Place bins with wheels nearest to your house.

Do not place bins on the road.





There are no collections on Good Friday, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. If Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a weekday (Monday to Friday), all bin collections following these specific public holidays will be collected the following day.

When you recycle with Containers for Change, you get a 10 cent refund for every eliable container you return.

- Step 1 collect eligible containers
- **Step 2** take them to a refund point
- **Step 3** earn a refund or donate

To return more than 1,500 containers at a time you'll need to sign a refund declaration form and provide identification. Please ask the staff for more information or assistance.

Bulk waste services



- Place separated material out for collection no earlier than 48 hours prior to your booked collection
- Material types will be collected separately from 6am on the booked collection date

Bulk Household Waste includes:

Green Waste

Garden waste, tree branches and twigs.

General Waste

Chairs, sofas, toys, cardboard. Too large for your normal bin.

E-Waste

Computers and TVs only.

Metal

Scrap metal, fridges, washing machines.

Mattresses only.









So that different waste types can be collected and recycled separately, you will need to sort waste into piles on your verge as shown above. This will ensure less of your waste goes to landfill. Each household can place onto the verge up to 3 cubic metres of waste per collection.

Do not obstruct the footpath, your normal bin service or the line of sight for motorists.

Do not place any waste on driveways, near sprinklers, water meters, mail boxes, power poles, trees or other obstructions, as they may be damaged when waste is collected mechanically. To find out whether you have a 'pre-booked verge' collection service, go to www.swan.wa.gov.au

Household hazardous waste and disposable sites (back page)

Household hazardous waste (HHW) disposal

Some everyday household products are classed as Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and can contain chemicals or substances harmful to people and the environment. Examples include:



Flammables



batteries







Paint



Corrosives

Gas cylinders





Fire extinguishers (non-halon)



Fluorescent globes and tubes (CFLs)



Pesticides and herbicides

HHW can be safely disposed for free at the Red Hill Waste Management Facility.

Up to 20kg/L per material type. No commercial quantities.

Waste accepted at Red Hill Waste Management **Facility:**

- Televisions, computers and computer accessories (whole, unbroken items only).
- Household Hazardous Waste no commercial quantities. Chemicals must be in a sealed, suitable non-returnable container and where possible labelled with the chemical.
- General waste (fee payable).
- Asbestos (fee payable) must be twice-wrapped in thick plastic, taped and labelled "CAUTION ASBESTOS" in letters not less than 50mm high.

Do not mix HHW with general waste or recyclables.
